THOUGHTS TO PONDER

The most fundamental of all human sins is pride. It was at the root of the sin of Adam and Eve and was the reason for the ruin of Lucifer. Pride is at the heart of unbelief. Pride stands in the way of any person acknowledging his or her need of Christ. Pride prevents us from being reconciled to one another when our relationships are disrupted by sin. This self-serving aspect of our fallen nature does not just disappear when we are converted, though it does receive a mortal blow when we are humbled before Jesus. Pride takes our whole lifetime to die...

Scripture teaches us that God resists the proud but gladly receives the humble. Humility is to be a life-long attribute, not simply the attitude of our hearts when we first come to Christ. Every day we are to remember our own need of God's mercy, the problems and failures in our own lives, rather than making ourselves blind to our own sins by concentrating on those of others. So deep is the problem of pride that even God's good gifts to us can readily be turned by us into means of self-congratulation. This is true of spiritual gifts; it is true with any special blessing that we receive from God. Even biblical knowledge can make us proud, not because sound biblical knowledge is a problem, but because of the pride in our hearts that clasps on to anything that will help us to feel a little better about ourselves than about our fellow believers. Consider Jesus' words, "If you were blind, you would not be guilty of sin; but now that you claim that you can see, your guilt remains" (John 9:41), or those of Paul: "We know that we all possess knowledge. Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. The man who thinks he knows something does not yet know as he ought to know." (1 Corinthians 8:1-2)

Whatever our strengths as individuals, whatever blessings and gifts God gives us, these are the places in our lives where we have to be most on guard against pride. For example, if the strength and glory of our church or denomination is teaching and sound doctrine, then that is where pride will most likely enter in. That will be the area where we will indulge in self-congratulation before God; that will be where we turn our spiritual strengths into a weapon against others. More than anything else in our prayers for ourselves, we need to pray for a humble and grateful heart and clarity about the ease with which we become self-serving and full of pride.
